## JUNIOR CURLING PROGRAM

## Junior curling sign-up - Saturday, October 2, 2021 from 8-11 AM

Parents will be asked to sign up to help on ice and to bring snacks. We will use an online signup app for this.

**Dues:** \$30 for first year and \$60 after that.

Beginners: Saturdays 9:00 - 10:00

This level is primarily for youth ages 6 to 8. Most of these curlers will be new to curling or returning curlers who still need to work on skills. Curlers will learn basic delivery skills, ice safety, ice etiquette and sportsmanship.

Intermediate: Saturdays 10:00 - 11:00

This level is primarily for youth ages 8 to 10. The majority have learned the basic skills and are ready to put them to use. Sliding, balance, delivery, sweeping skills will be emphasized. As the season progresses students will play half sheet games and learn basic strategy. Some curlers may be moved up into the developmental group once they are able to consistently throw the stone to the other end with a balanced delivery.

Developmental: Saturdays 11:00 – 12:00

This level is for middle school curlers with limited experience. Time will be spent learning or perfecting deliveries, sweeping skills, strategy, etiquette, sportsmanship, and half-sheet and full sheet game play. As curlers improve, they may be moved up to the competitive group.

Competitive: Saturdays 12:00 – 2:00

This level is for junior curlers who have developed their delivery and are ready to play more games, learn more strategy, and compete in bonspiels. Registration for this group will be based on last year's skill level. The goal is for all curlers to compete in at least one junior bonspiel this year. Bonspiel dates will be available at sign-up. When ice is available, you are allowed to use Monday nights open ice to practice.

New this year! U15 League on Friday afternoons from 4:00 – 5:15 for curlers in 8<sup>th</sup> grade or lower who would like to work on their bonspiel and playdown skills. The league will be a combination of skills, strategy, and game play. It will run approximately eight weeks and will be conducted by the HS coaches and players. Dues are \$60. If they also play on Saturday, there is no addition fee.

Parents with children who bonspiel outside of the PCC must take the Safe Sport Training. You will be provided with the training information.



#### FRIENDLY REMINDER

Dues should be paid, and the release form signed **BEFORE** you step on the ice. Skips, it is your responsibility to make sure all members on your team have paid their dues. The treasurer will be at each of the leagues during the first two weeks of the season to help facilitate this. If you want to pay with a credit card, see the information below.

On December 1st, a list of curlers with unpaid dues will be posted. After Dec. 15th, any team that plays with a curler who has not paid dues will forfeit those games.

## **Credit Card Payments**

During the first two weeks for a 3% fee, you will be able to use a credit card to pay for your dues. The swipe device is directly linked to our bank. You can still pay with a check or cash.

- \*\*Friday afternoon league is open to all juniors in 8<sup>th</sup> grade or younger from Portage and surrounding areas. This will be a competitive instruction league and augments the Saturday Junior Program. For more information, see the JUNIOR CURLING PROGRAM page.
- \*\*Thursday is an open league allowing men and women as well as sons and daughters to curl together. If there are enough teams to have two draws, a bell system will be implemented to ensure that the 8:00 draw is on time.
- \*\*The Friday Night Mixed League welcomes any new and experienced curlers ages 21 and older. Because of its relaxed, social atmosphere, this league is a great opportunity to introduce new curlers to the game. The mixed format means that two males and two females make up a team and the throw order alternates (boygirl-boy-girl).

Note that subbing rules apply (a maximum of three times subbing on other leagues or full membership dues will be charged).



# Playdown system for 2021 – 2022

- No change to the men's playdown system, except only Monday Dinner League and Wednesday Men's League teams qualify. Thursday open all-male teams of 50 pts or less are eligible for the club playdowns instead of Men's playdowns.
- Starting this season, women are rated (assigned points on the 5 to 20 points scale).
- Any team in any league other than Monday Dinner League and Wednesday Men's League with 50 pts or less are eligible for club playdowns. This includes the Women's League, the Open League, and the Mixed League.
- The club playdowns will consist of 8 teams drawn from the eligible leagues (method TBD, likely to be a fixed number of eligible teams from each league proportional to the number of 50-point eligible teams in the league).
- Club playdowns will start the Tuesday of playdown week. Club playdown quarterfinals on Tuesday will have the second draw (8:00pm).
- Club playdown semifinals are Wednesday at 6:30pm and club playdown finals (Club Championship eligibility game) are Thursday at 6:30pm.
- The Club Championship game will be 6:30pm Friday of playdown week between the winner of the Club Championship eligibility game and the Men's Playdown Champion.
- If there is a Women's League and a women's only playdown or championship game, then the women's
  playdown or championship would need to be concluded in the week before the men's and club
  playdowns. The winner of the women's league championship would receive a spot in the club
  playdowns.
- If it is desired to have more than 8 teams play in the Club Championship bracket, it is possible for a 'play in' draw for up to 4 more teams on the Sunday night before playdown week, which would increase the field to 10, 11, or 12 teams. Depending on the Men's League bye situation, some of these play-in games could be offered to play on Monday instead of Sunday (each bye granted in the Men's championship bracket results in a sheet available on the Monday of playdowns).
