### III. Review PowerPoint Informational Presentation, including League Budget, Financials and LCLL Constitution

- a. Introduction of volunteers and board members- LCLL is all volunteer based. All volunteers must complete a background check to be on a field. 24 board members, 59 team moms and 204 game day coaches.
- b. We offer the divisions of Int, Majors, AAA, AA, A, Rookie, CP, Challenger
- c. LCLL has a lease with the city of LC for our fields. The city is responsible for all common areas (this includes parking lots, walkways, concessions and restrooms) and LCLL manages the dirt and infields.
- d. As part of our lease, the city is compensated with 15% of concession stand profits and any out of boundary fees collected by the league.
- e. LCLL is responsible for concessions equipment and field equipment
- f. This past summer we spent ~\$170,000 to renovate infields. We added turf pitching circle, home plate and replaced all live grass on the infields with a better quality baseball hybrid grass. This was funded 100% by LCLL.
- g. We are currently in the process of upgrading the dugouts to a larger 12ftx30ft covered dugout.
- h. New equipment will be assembled this year. Loaner catchers equipment will be available to coaches this season.
- i. Sponsorships will continue at the team and league levels.
- j. Local Options - when leagues decide to deviate from the Blue Book they must be approved by our board and approved by our district administrator. It is very important to read and know this information.
- k. Constitution - Our constitution was updated this season and is available online to view.
- l. Financial Report - Fiscal Year runs July 1st to June 30th
- m. We currently bank at ACU and we have 0 past due invoices
- n. As of 12/31/25, Checking \$237,423.60 Savings \$52,384.40 Money Market \$29,512.91 - The Money Market account is what paid for many of our upgrades.

### IV. Questions:

- a. Can you explain League City Grit?
  - i. A select organization that is running parallel with League City Little League. Maintains its

own 501C3 and Board of Directors. The Board consists of Shane Johnston, Matt Birkenseher, Christina Ogrin, Chuck Beckworth, & Terrance Coursen.

- ii. The idea behind LC Grit is to follow a similar pattern as NASA United. Allowing for the higher caliber players to practice and compete together in the fall season with a few Spring interactions.
- iii. All players must be members of League City Little League to participate in LC Grit
- iv. LC Grit has the potential to be the same players from the Spring All-Stars but it is not a requirement of the team. The coaches are able to hold tryouts and make team decisions as they see fit. The only requirement is that they MUST play LCLL in the Spring & can not play for any other select team to be part of LC Grit.
- v. Most LC Grit games will be played in the Summer & Fall season to not interfere with LCLL practices, games and special events. All players are expected to put LCLL first during the Spring season.

b. Can you explain 501C3?

c. All-Stars -

- i. There are “grumblings” that you do not have enough all-star teams for the size of our league.
  - 1. 7U-9U is not sanctioned by LLI for All-Stars therefore we can have 2 teams (per our district administrator, Jessie Brantley). We had 2 teams for 8U & 9U last Spring. As a board we did not feel we had enough high caliber talent playing in Single A as 7U players to create 2 teams. LLI says that we can only have 1 team in 10U, 11U, 12U, & 13U because we only have 1 charter.
- ii. Why can't rookie ball players participate in All-Stars?
  - 1. The level of play between Rookie and Single A is significant and it has been set years prior to not include Rookie players to participate in All-Stars
- iii. Do you feel that your All-Star teams had enough opportunities to play?
  - 1. With the All-Star schedule they are able to play for 4-6 weeks with daily practices. By the time All-Star season is over, families are wanting to take summer vacations so yes, we believe our all-star teams are happy with the number of opportunities provided by their respective brackets.
