VICE PRESIDENT OF TOURNAMENTS

The team was limited to 12 players to ensure playing time. The volunteer coach and selected players had focused practices every Sunday throughout the season, and competed in a few scheduled games as well as tournaments.

The tournaments available in the area have become more and more fierce throughout the years due to the ever growing number of "elite" travel teams that enter them. Although our Americans teams always play well, the records aren't as important to us as the growth of the individual players as a whole. I set a high standard for what I wanted the players to learn this year, and the players, parents and coaches more than lived up to it.

I want to thank Steve Milkovich and his assistants (all volunteers) for not only dedicating their time, but also conveying sportsmanship and fostering a sense of competitiveness and love for the game to our WABL players. Thanks as well to our sponsors who gave generously to our tournament program.

The 2017 Americans program will be focused once again on our 9-10 year olds who will not reach the age of 11 before May 1st. We hope that we can further expand the program in the future as numbers allow. Tryouts will be announced and further information will be forthcoming.
